IMPORTANT NOTICE - NEW BEGINNINGS UPDATE

In recent weeks it has become clear that it will not be possible for the Church of England or Toothill Church to either purchase or rent the Toothill Church building from the Methodist Church (Toothill Church is a Methodist Foundation and the building has always belonged to the Methodist Church).

In the light of that the Upper Thames Methodist Circuit have extended an invitation to Toothill Church to become a Methodist Church, soley under Methodist governance, within the circuit. Reverend Shirlyn Toppin, Circuit Superintendent Minister, recognises the value of maintaining worship and outreach within the Toothill Community, and is keen to support its future growth.

At a recent meeting Toothill Church Committee gave prayerful consideration to the invitation. We saw continued worship, outreach and the growth of God's Kingdom in West Swindon, as top priorities going forward. Based on that the Committee made the following recommendation to the Toothill Church family following worship on Sunday December 3rd.

The Upper Thames Methodist Circuit have extended an invitation to Toothill Church to become a Methodist Church, soley under Methodist governance, within the circuit. The Church Committee recommends acceptance of the invitation. We will give formal notice of an open church meeting to be held in January, to give our full consideration to the invitation and ensure all our folk have the opportunity to be heard. The Church Committee will meet after the open meeting and issue a statement of intent. How we work with former partners will be discussed later. The Anglican ministers currently based at Toothill will still be licensed to West Swindon and Lydiard Tregoze. Westlea continue to explore their options for going forward and hope to have greater clarity by their AGM next March.

Due to these developments, and further conversations with the denominations, it is possible that the Partnership could dissolve towards the end of 2024. Whenever it comes the Executive, and Clive particularly, hope that the ending will be a good one, and that is what we are praying for and working towards. Linda Nicholas and Rachel Dowling are supporting the Executive with the administration of specific tasks related to the ending of the Partnership.

The Partnership Council Meeting on January 25th at 7.30pm (venue to be confirmed) will be an open meeting. We ask all church leadership teams to be present, and invite everyone, as this will be an opportunity to be updated on the very latest developments.
